x	state vector
u	control input vector
w	noise vector
z	regulated output vector
y	measurement vector

2 Model Equations

State Vector and Input Vector:

$$x \in \mathbb{R}^4 \quad u \in \mathbb{R}^2 \quad w \in \mathbb{R}^4 \quad z \in \mathbb{R}^6 \quad y \in \mathbb{R}^4$$

System Equations:

$$\dot{x}(t) = Ax(t) + B_1w(t) + Bu(t) \tag{1a}$$

$$z(t) = C_1x(t) + D_{11}w(t) + D_{12}u(t) \tag{1b}$$

$$y(t) = Cx(t) + D_{21}w(t) \tag{1c}$$

Outputs: z

C	$\begin{bmatrix} 1.0 & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 1.0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 1.0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 1.0 \end{bmatrix}$
D_{11}	$\begin{bmatrix} 0 & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 0 \end{bmatrix}$
D_{12}	$\begin{bmatrix} 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 \\ 1.0 & 0 \\ 0 & 1.0 \end{bmatrix}$
D_{21}	$\begin{bmatrix} 0 & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 0 & 0 \end{bmatrix}$

4 Simulation

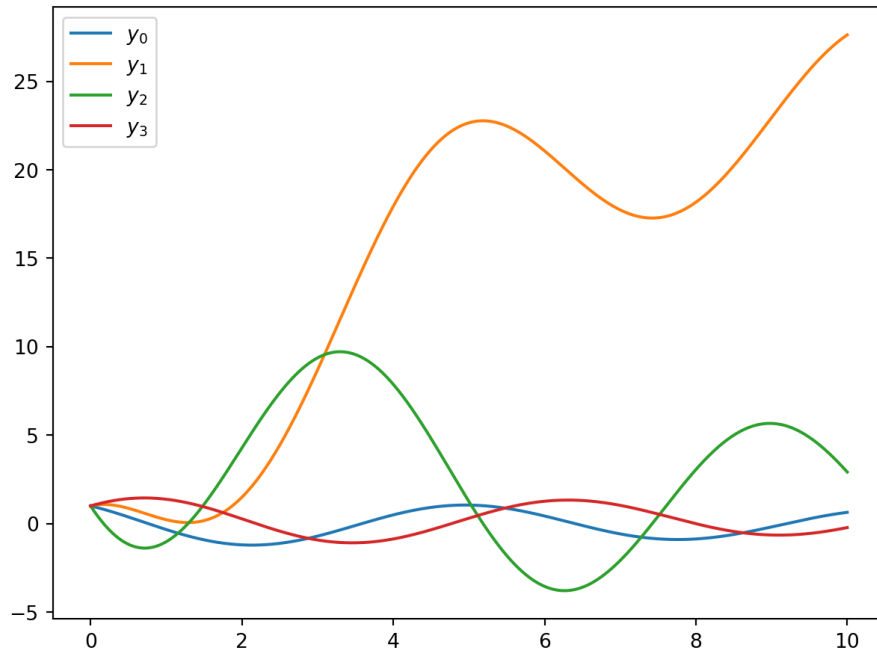


Figure 1: Simulation of the Mach 2.7 flight condition of a supersonic transport aircraft.
